In this workshop, we present how Service-Learning pedagogy is implemented in various entities and programs at the Université Catholique de Lille, in particular through the example of the Law Bus (Faculty of Law). This talk also analyzes one of the specific impacts of Service-Learning by cross-referencing students' experience of re-reading with the ternary "body-psyche-spirit" anthropology and certain key elements of Christian Social Thought.

Visit of Palais Rameau, the demonstrator of agriculture and food of tomorrow

Familiar to the people of Lille, the Palais Rameau was conceived from its

creation as a building open to all, dedicated to research and innovation accessible to all, in connection with horticulture. Fourteen decades later and with the collaboration of the City of Lille, which is handing over this emblematic site to our association by means of a 25-year emphyteutic lease, JUNIA wants to bring it new souffle while respecting the soul of the place. Construction began in October 2021, with an opening in February 2025

Visit of PRISMM: Simulation Center & Anatomy Lab, Faculty of Medicine, Maieutic and Health Sciences

Simulation has become essential in the training of health professionals. It allows the acquisition of technical and non-technical skills in conditions close to reality and without danger for the patient. The FMMS's PRISMM (Centre for Pedagogy and Research by Immersion and Simulation in Medicine and Midwifery) is equipped with 4 high-tech computer-controlled mannequins, an ultrasound simulator and numerous procedural simulators. On the other hand, the Anatomy Laboratory is equipped with an Anatomage® table, a state-of-the-art 3D visualisation and virtual dissection tool.
